STEWARDSHIP OF GOD'S EARTH

During the cold season many people set their thermostat a little warmer than necessary. Home heating accounts for over a quarter of your home heating bill. You can turn your thermostat down and still be quite comfortable. During the day when people are home, set the thermostat at 'sweater' temperature: between 65 and 68 degrees. When you retire for the evening, set the thermostat at "blanket" temperature: 55-58 degrees. Installing a programmable thermostat can reduce your heating bill by 20%.

The majority of fuel for home heating is from natural gas, propane, and oil. Less than 1% of home heating comes from solar, geothermal, wind or wood. Oil is the overwhelming fuel of choice which contributes more than 40% of our energy needs. More than half of America's electricity-generating plants burn coal. Ninety percent of future electricity generating plants of the future will burn natural gas. The reserves of coal can handle the nation's needs for the next 200 to 300 years. Coal is a huge source of potential energy for the nation, which is why it is so important to find and implement ways to burn it more cleanly.

Many new home constructions are implementing non-renewable (such as geothermal) sources of energy. Although the original investment is considerably higher, it pays for itself in a relatively short time. It doesn't require a large expanse of land to install and requires very minimal electricity to operate.

I think one of the most important things in life is to be in a good mood and enjoy what you have, where ever you are.
