MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KEN

Greetings in Christ Jesus our Lord and Savior.

We read here in 1st Corinthians how Paul wants to reach more people, even if it means stretching boundaries and venturing into new and unfamiliar practices. I believe this is the emerging mission for our community of faith here at Immanuel Lutheran in Strum.

In the spirit of this mission, beginning September 21, we will be adding a second service to our Sunday morning worship schedule. However, it will not be a carbon copy of the 9am service, nor will that 9 am service be changing. The 9am service fits the needs of our community of faith that faithfully comes Sunday after Sunday. There is nothing wrong with it, nor does it lack anything, and I believe that the people who do enjoy this worship service deserve for it to remain and grow as it has been. This is the backbone of our community of faith, and I am deeply thankful for all who are committed to supporting the church with resources and their prayers.

The 11:15am service will be a format geared to reach out to the surrounding community, to invite back those who have become inactive, to embrace those who have drifted away from faith, and to, in faith, draw new people into God's fold of Gospel promise and transformation. We will follow the lead of God's Spirit, which means that we really don't know what it will grow into, and also means that it is an exciting opportunity to see God work. The tone of the service will be more casual in some ways, matching the culture that surrounds us, and more formal in other ways, incorporating some ancient elements from the early centuries of the church.

In addition, we will begin a study on September 21st loosely following the book, "We Make the Road by Walking" by Brian McLaren, which will meet during the Sunday school hour beginning at 10:30am.

Also, as some may have noticed, there are other services held during the week for anyone who is interested in joining. Monday morning prayer at 9am, Wednesday Communion at 12noon, Thursday evening prayer at 7pm, and Saturday night prayer at 9pm. These are services found in the ELW and follow the pattern of prayers established by Christian communities of faith going back hundreds of years to the early church followers.

It is my prayer that one or more of these opportunities will connect with you as you seek an encounter with our risen Savior Jesus Christ. Come and see...

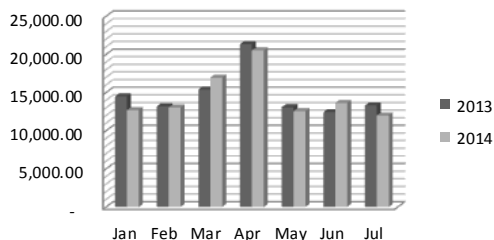

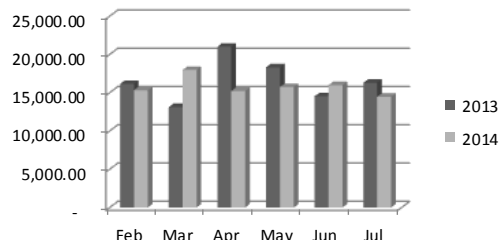

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

Date: July 27, 2014

Time: 9:50 a.m.

Location: Immanuel Lutheran Church Sanctuary

Meeting called to order at 9:50 a.m. by: Jim Tocko, Council President

Opening prayer led by Pastor Ken Taylor

1. Approval of the constitution

The constitution has not been amended in over 10 years. A copy of the constitution has been made available for your review along with the proposed changes. Open for discussion. No discussion noted. Motion entertained for approval. Motion made by Marie Murrell to accept proposed changes to the constitution and bylaws; second by Camille Skoug. Motion carried.

2. Election of council members

Treasurer: Nominee - Michelle Peaslee (incumbent)

Secretary: Nominee – Kate Back

At-large members (2): Nominees – Howard Hanson (incumbent) and
Camille Skoug

Floor opened for other nominations. No other nominations noted. Two nominees for the Endowment Fund Committee were added to the agenda from the floor: Tom Wagener and Vickie Hanson, no additional nominees. Motion entertained for the approval of all nominees to the Congregational Council. Motion made by Tom Wagener; second by {inaudible}. Motion carried. Motion entertained for the approval of the nominees to the Endowment Fund Committee for a three year term. Motion made by Sara Heck; second by {inaudible}. Motion carried.

3. Education-wing window project

We have been looking at new window treatments for the education-wing (Fellowship Hall) windows. The current treatments are in bad shape and are a haven for bats. We are putting this project on hold until approximately September while the building committee researches alternative window treatments. The options will then be published in the newsletter and/or bulletins and the congregation will then make a decision as to the course of action necessary to replace the window treatments.

4. Giving envelopes

We spend close to \$1000.00 per year to print boxes of envelopes. Many of them are not picked up. Even the ones that are picked up, many of those envelopes are not used. The Council feels that we could spend a lot less money by having them printed by a different publisher (local) or by printing them ourselves. Instead of sending the envelopes out [to congregation members], we would put them in the pews. They would be generic envelopes that you could put your name, number, amount, and the fund to which you want the money directed.

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Jim is personally going to sign up for electronic giving for the first of the year; so is Marie. Sara Heck discussed her experience with electronic giving. Tom Wagener likes the idea and will ask for 12 envelopes at the beginning of the year as that is what he uses. Clarice Bergerson expressed concern with the weekly offering if there were no envelopes as she has been a counter for many years and has seen the reduction in giving over the years. Kevin asked about special funds (proposed solution is to focus on one fund per month) and Camille Skoug asked about making envelopes available to those who want them, and may be have a hard time transitioning (recycling the left over envelopes from this year for next year-assembling “boxes” of the new envelopes). Clarice Bergerson also suggested eliminating the extra envelopes as only 10 or so households use them each month and they are an extra, unnecessary cost to the church. Don Haukeness made a motion to go to the new generic envelope system proposed by the Council; second by {inaudible}. Motion carried.

5. Pastor Ken

100-year anniversary

In 1915 the brick church was built and first used for services. We need someone who is willing to get the ball rolling for the 100-year celebration of the sanctuary. This is a great opportunity to celebrate the ministry. Some suggestions for the celebration include: a community banquet; appearances by previous ministers; launching a new ministry; performing God’s work in the world. Matthew Nelson volunteered to head up a committee to plan the celebration with a goal of being held after Easter or in early summer. An update is to be given at the Annual Congregational meeting. Anyone interested in being a part of the committee is to contact Matt after the meeting.

Direction of ministry

Prayer services are being held on Mondays at 9 a.m., Wednesdays at 12 p.m., Thursdays at 7 p.m., and Saturdays at 9 p.m. as a way to capture a modified version of past daily prayers. The services are located in the red hymnals. This provides another avenue for people to gather together for mutual support and contemplation at no additional cost to the church.

A second service will be added to Sunday beginning September 21, at 11:15 a.m. after Sunday school. This is an effort to reach out to those who cannot make it to the 9 a.m. service and for whom traditional services do not attract. We do not want to change the 9 a.m. service because it is precious. This second service offers an opportunity to provide a more contemporary service while maintaining our established traditions, and allows us to offer several points of entrance shaped by the Word of God. Acoustic Sunday will be offered at the 9 a.m. service when Jeanette needs a break.

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

We are called to remember that God loves our neighbor too. Let us walk with them in their struggles and show the love of Christ as we do that.

Currently the food pantry is open on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, or by appointment by calling Michelle in the church office. The food pantry will be expanded to the 3rd and 4th Tuesday of each month in hopes of reaching more people in need.

The Eleva-Strum Community Support Network offers a backpack program for kids on the weekends. Many of these children would go without food on the weekends if it were not for this program. Through the summer, bags are available for pick-up in the church office on Thursdays and Fridays.

A new community dinner program is set to begin September 28. This program will be headed up by Michelle Peaslee. "Village Café" will serve meals to those in need at no cost on the 4th Sunday of each month at the Village Hall in Strum. Please see Michelle after the meeting if you are interested in assisting with this project.
